BIG TRUTH: GOD IS VICTOR

Deuteronomy 20:1-4; Proverbs 21:30; John 16:33; 2 Corinthians 2:14-17; Colossians 2:10-15; 2 Timothy 1:10

BIBLE VERSE: 1 CORINTHIANS 15:55-57

“O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

BIG IDEAS

- God is victorious over sin and death.
- God is victorious over our sin and death.
- We fight for victory from God’s victory.

BIBLE STORY: 1 SAMUEL 17

David was not the most likely candidate for a hero for Israel. He was a young shepherd boy who was sent by his father to bring lunch to his older brothers. Though David was not the most likely hero, he had a hero-sized faith in the victory of God. When he saw Goliath on the hill, he did not trust in his strength, but in the strength of God and he defeated Goliath in God’s power. David knew that God always wins His battles.

STORY: NEW CREATION

Part of the beauty of the gospel is that God does not just rescue us from the power of sin, but He is also making everything new. God offers new creation to those who place their faith in Jesus. This newness comes in two ways. The first is that by breaking the power of sin, Jesus is making men and women into brand new people with new identities. Second, God is not only making people new, but He is also going to make a new heaven and a new earth for us to live on and worship Him in.

BIG AIMS



Every child should know that:

- God has given us a holy mission to make Him known to others



Every child should feel:

- Burdened for those in their lives who do not know Jesus



Every child should:

- Share the gospel with someone who does not know Jesus



Every child should want:

- To live faithfully on mission for God and be aligned with His purposes instead of our own

FAMILY DEVOTION: GOD IS THE SOURCE OF ALL LIFE

Before Saul knew Jesus, he was spiritually dead. He was lost in his sin and was not really living. After he encountered Jesus, he began to really live and became alive in Christ.

GOD IS VICTOR

BIBLE VERSE: 1 CORINTHIANS 15:55-57

“O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting? The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Death holds no power over God because He is victorious.

- God is more powerful than death.
- He proved His power when Jesus rose from the grave.
- God proved His victory over death through the death and resurrection of His Son.
- God has triumphed over our sin and the death that our sin causes.

We join in God’s victory over death.

- Jesus conquered death and hell when He died on the cross.
- He overcame our sin on the cross.
- He defeated death when He was buried and then came to life again on the third day.
- He is victorious and we share in that victory when we have saving faith in Him.
- When we turn from our sins and believe in Jesus, we, too, become victorious.
- Our physical bodies may die in this life, but we are raised to new life in eternity.

We experience victory over our sin through Jesus.

- Because of Jesus’ death and resurrection, we can have victory over our sin.
- We no longer have to be enslaved by our sin.
- We can experience freedom and choose to not sin because of the work that Jesus did on the cross.
- Our victory comes from Jesus and we can experience the freedom His victory brings when we place saving faith in Him.

BIBLE STORY: 1 SAMUEL 17

David and Goliath

Opening Illustration:

Prior to class, cut out medium sized shields from cardstock or heavy paper. Give each child a blank shield and ask the children to create a shield that reminds them of God’s power. An example can be drawing a picture of a cross and writing the name “Jesus” on the shield. Another example can be drawing pictures of creation showing how powerful God is since He created the world from nothing. Talk with the children about how God is powerful and He is making a New Creation.

STORY: NEW CREATION

GOD IS VICTOR

BIG IDEA: GOD IS VICTORIOUS OVER SIN AND DEATH.

God fights the battle against sin and death.

- God's perfect world was broken by man's sin.
- Man's rejection of God caused the perfect world to break and sin to enter the heart of man.
- God fights the sin battle and is victorious.
- Goliath and the Philistines waged a battle against the Israelites.
- David fought Goliath and was victorious.
- God fought sin and won the battle when He sacrificed His only Son.



Give each child a smooth stone and markers or paint pens. Ask the children to decorate their stones. As they decorate their stones, talk with them about how God has victory over sin and death. He defeated Goliath through David and He defeated our sin and death through Jesus.

God has overcome death and sin.¹

- David overcame Goliath and defeated him.
- When God sent Jesus to the earth, He overcame sin and death.
- God has all the victory over sin and death.
- David had victory over the Philistines because he defeated Goliath.
- God has victory over both sin and its consequence, death.

God has defeated all sin and death.

- There is no sin that is too great for God.
- There is no sin that overcomes God because God is mightier and greater than everything.
- Not only is God greater and mightier, He has defeated sin by sending His Son to pay our sin debt.
- God has also defeated death and removed all its power by raising Jesus from the dead.
- Death is defeated and we'll experience that victory when we are in Heaven with Jesus.

What has God defeated? (He has defeated sin and death.)

How does God's defeat of sin and death help us? (It means that we no longer have to be enslaved to sin and we do not have to fear death.)

1. 2 Timothy 1:10: God is the victor over sin and death and that means we can have victory through Him.

STORY: NEW CREATION

GOD IS VICTOR

BIG IDEA: GOD IS VICTORIOUS OVER OUR SIN AND DEATH.²

Our sin holds us captive, but God rules over it.

- Goliath held the Israelites captive by frightening them and keeping them from fighting him.
- Our sin keeps us blinded and enslaved.
- David set the Israelites free by defeating Goliath.
- God sets us free by defeating our sin and the death we deserve.



Have the children define the words “victory” and “sin.” Ask the children to name some sins that people need victory over. Remind them that God has victory over our sin and death.

Sin rules over us, but God reigns over sin.

- Sin is our captor. We are enslaved to it until we have saving faith in Jesus.
- Just like the Israelites could not defeat Goliath, we cannot defeat our sin.
- Death rules over us as long as we are enslaved to our sin.
- God defeated our sin and death through Jesus.
- David defeated Goliath and the Philistines.
- We have victory because God has victory.

We are set free from our sin because of God’s victory over our sin.

- We are no longer held captive by our sin when we place our faith in Jesus because God has defeated our sin.
- When Jesus took on our sin debt on the cross, He paid the price that we owed.
- Now, we have freedom from our sin when we place our faith in Him as our Savior.
- We can walk in God’s victory over our sin.

How do we have freedom from our sin? (God defeated our sin when Jesus died on the cross in our place.)

2. 1 Peter 3:18: Jesus conquered death and hell. He defeated our sin and now we can live in His victory.

STORY: NEW CREATION

GOD IS VICTOR

BIG IDEA: WE FIGHT FOR VICTORY FROM GOD'S VICTORY.

We can overcome sin only through Jesus.

- Our sin holds us captive.
- Our sin blinds us and keeps us from seeing the truth.
- We have no power over our sin except through Jesus.
- Jesus has victory over all sin and death.
- We can have victory through Him.
- David believed in God's victory.
- David fought Goliath trusting in God's victory.



Have the children read Ephesians 6:10-18. Talk with the children about the different parts of the armor of God and remind them that we can have victory through God's victory.

We claim Jesus' victory as ours when we have saving faith in Him.

- The Israelites had victory through David's victory.
- They had freedom through David's victory and David had victory through God's victory.
- We have victory through Jesus.
- He fought our battle against sin and defeated sin.
- When we place our faith in Him, we live in His victory.
- We fight our battle in His victory.
- We are no longer overcome by sin and death because of His victory.
- We can walk in freedom and live in Jesus' freedom.

We do not have to fear fighting the battle because of God's victory.³

- Jesus fought our sin battle for us.
- He took on the sin of every person. He had the full cup of God's anger and wrath poured out on Him and He died in our place.
- He was buried and on the third day, He rose to life again.
- His victory over our sin and death means we don't have to fear fighting battles in this life.
- When we trust God's victory and believe in Him, we can have faith in the battle.
- We can fight like David fought, knowing that God always wins His battles.

Why do we not have to fear fighting battles? (When we trust in God's victory, we know that there is nothing to fear because He always wins His battles.)

3. Matthew 10:28: We do not have to fear because God always wins His battles.

What Is Victory?

Help the children create a chart that compares man's victory with God's victory. Talk with the children about the differences between the victory that man experiences and the victory that God has.



- Man is not all-powerful and he cannot overcome everything.
- Man cannot overcome death, but God has victory over death.
- Man cannot overcome sin, but God has victory over sin.
- God's victory is available to us when we repent and believe in Jesus.



The Lord's Armor

Bring in a large piece of paper, or put several pieces together, to create the outline of a person. Then, using everyday objects such as paper towel rolls, duct tape, newspaper, etc., have the children make the different aspects of the armor of God from Ephesians 6:10-18 to put on the outline of the person. Lead the children in a discussion about how we can have victory through God's victory.
