BIG IDEAS

- Be occupied with the Word.
- Be courageous in the face of persecution.
- Be bold to make Jesus known.

BIBLE PASSAGE: ACTS 18:1-23; JOSHUA 1:5-9**KNEEL: LIVING ON MISSION**

The Kneel Year is an exploration of what it means to worship God with our all (Luke 10:26-28) and to use our influence to lead others to do the same. We know that as we pursue a life of worship, we will pursue a life of both wisdom and mission. Throughout this year we will study and pursue the wisdom of God through the book of Proverbs and the mission of God through the book of Acts, and we will learn how both of these things must inform and shape our influence as Jesus followers!

- Read, study, and meditate on the entire book of Acts.
- Memorize the Bible verse each week.
- Pray consistently for boldness to make Jesus known.

**Every student should want...**

- To pursue faithfulness in living on mission.
- To share the gospel with people in their lives who do not know Jesus.
- To sacrifice their personal freedoms for the sake of the gospel

STUDENT WORKOUT:

This week we will ponder what it means that God is with us everywhere. We will pray for boldness to share the Gospel everywhere. We will practice telling others in the face of persecution.

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Read Acts 18:1-23 this week and make notes in your journal. Answer the questions below in your journal as well:

- In Acts 18:1-6, what response to the Gospel did Paul first experience? Did this prevent Paul from continuing to share the Gospel in other places?
- When Paul went to the house of Titius Justus, what was the response to the Gospel? How did Paul respond to this?
- What did God reveal to Paul during his stay in Corinth?
- What was Paul's response to God's revelation to him?
- What happened to Paul when the Jews made a united attack against him?
- How do Paul's actions reveal he trusted and believed God?

Read and meditate on Acts 18:1-23 this week. Use the questions below to guide your meditation:

- Ponder if you truly believe that God is with you everywhere you are.
- Consider how you can live with boldness, declaring the Gospel to others.
- Ponder ways you can grow in your trust of God's command to not fear because He is always with His people.



Pray with your parents this week.

- Ask God to help you trust that He is always with His people.
- Pray with your small group leader this week. Ask God to help you proclaim the Gospel in boldness.



Memorize Acts 18:9-10 this week.

- Ask a friend or your parents to help you learn the verses.
- Make a list of some of the reasons you do not share the Gospel with others. On your list, write more than fear or worry. Put specific reasons that you do not share the Gospel. Next, use a concordance to look up verses that remind you that God is always with you. Write a few of these down.
- Meet with your small group leader to discuss some of the reasons on your list. Talk through ways that you can overcome them and commit to do so this week.
