KNEEL: LIVING ON MISSION

FOCUS: LIVING ON MISSION / SERIES: ACTS

Read Acts 20:17-38 this week and make notes in your journal. Answer the questions below in your journal as well:

- Describe the way Paul says he lived among the Ephesians in verses 17-21.
- What does it mean that Paul did not shrink from teaching in public and from house to house?
- As Paul prepares to go to Jerusalem, knowing that he will likely face imprisonment or attack, what is his attitude about serving the Lord?
- To what does Paul tell the elders to pay special attention to? Why does he do this?
- In verse 32, what does Paul say the Word of God is able to do for the Ephesian elders and believers?

Read and meditate on Acts 20:17-38 this week. Use these questions to guide your meditation:

- Ponder what it means to live for Jesus daily. How can you adjust your life so that you are living for Him daily?
- Consider what it looks like for you to declare the Word of God publicly. Do you shrink from doing this or do you boldly declare God's truth?
- Ponder how you live your life privately. Do you seek to teach God's Word to others in community?



Pray with your parents this week.

- As you pray together ask God to help you to share His truth boldly publicly and privately.
- Meet with your small group leader this week for prayer. Pray that God would show you habits that you need to give up so you can live more fully for Jesus.



Memorize Acts 20:27 this week.

- Ask a friend or your parents to help you.
- Gather a few of your friends together this week for a time to study and discuss the Bible together. Choose a passage ahead of time. Study it and prepare to discuss it with your friends. Ask your parents to help you prepare.
- Meet with your small group leader to discuss a time when you can practice sharing God's truth publicly. Discuss some ways you can lead others or ways you can begin to train to do so.
