BIG IDEAS

- In faith we continue to preach the Gospel in every circumstance.
- In faith we purpose that the advance of the gospel is worth our lives.
- In faith we trust God to work.

BIBLE PASSAGE: ACTS 14

KNEEL: LIVING ON MISSION

The Kneel Year is an exploration of what it means to worship God with our all (Luke 10:26-28) and to use our influence to lead others to do the same. FAMILY WORKOUT:

This week we will ponder how to discuss with our son or daughter what it means to persevere for the advance of the gospel. We will pray with them to die to themselves and live for the gospel. We will lead them to practice trusting that God is working even when they cannot see Him working.





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Read Acts 14 and make notes in your journal. Answer the questions below in your journal as well:

- Read Acts 14:1-7. Make note of the events in these verses. What action of the disciples led to the unbelieving Jews becoming upset?
- Did Paul and Barnabas stop preaching the gospel when they faced opposition? Why or why not?
- Read Acts 14:8-18. Make note of the events of these verses. What was the result of Paul and Barnabas preaching the gospel?
- Why was Paul stoned? What happened after he was stoned and what does this reveal about his faith? The faith of the disciples?

Read and meditate on Acts 14 this week. Use these questions to guide your meditation:

- Ponder how to discuss with your son or daughter the truth that faith leads us to consider the advancement of the gospel worth our lives.
- Consider how to model for your son or daughter the truth that faith leads us to trust that God is working even when we cannot see Him working.
- Ponder how to discuss with your son or daughter ways to continue sharing the gospel in trials.



Pray with your son or daughter this week.

- Ask God to give them a heart that trusts God in every circumstance and that desires to spread the gospel no matter what.
- Pray with your student this week. Ask God to lead them to persevere in every circumstance.



Memorize Acts 14:21-22 with your son or daughter this week.

- Write the verses on an index card and review them with your son or daughter daily.
- Discuss with your son or daughter what it means to consider the advancement of the gospel worth your life. Share some of the things you've given up for the sake of the gospel. Discuss some of the things your son or daughter should give up so they can better share the gospel.
- Meet with your student to discuss ways that he or she can grow in their trust that God is at work. Remind them of ways that God has worked in your church and through them.
