BIG TRUTH: SIN IS A REJECTION OF GOD

Genesis 6:5; Isaiah 53:6; 2 Kings 17:15; Jeremiah 10:1-15; Isaiah 44:9-20

BIBLE VERSE: ROMANS 1:25

"Because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever! Amen."

BIG IDEAS

- Sin leads us to doubt God's goodness.
- Sin leads us to believe the lie that God is not enough.
- Sin leads us to reject God's rule and reign.

BIBLE PASSAGE: ROMANS 1:18-25

KNEEL - I AM AN AMBASSADOR

The Kneel Year is an exploration of what it means to worship God with our all (Luke 10:26-28). Worship is not something that is limited to a service once a week, but instead occurs every day, in all of life. We are unceasing worshipers. Worship never stops, it only changes directions. In order to worship God with all of our heart, soul, strength, and mind, we must embrace our identity as image bearers. It is out of that identity that we can begin to live for God's glory in all of life (Colossians 3:17).

SERIES AIMS



Every student should know that...

- The gospel is the good news of Jesus Christ that brings salvation to sinners.
- Salvation comes by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone.
- Jesus followers have been trusted with the gospel in order to share it with others.



Every student should strive to...

- Share the gospel each month with at least one person who does not know Jesus.
- Practice sharing the gospel using multiple different tools or methods.



Every student should feel...

- Humbled that as believers we have been entrusted with the glorious gospel of our Savior.
- Satisfied in Jesus as the only true Savior



Every student should want...

- To grow in awareness of the false saviors they are tempted to put their hope in.
- To have a softened heart and love for people who are lost
- To take advantage of opportunities to share the gospel with people in their lives who need Christ

FAMILY WORKOUT:

This week we will ponder how to discuss with our son or daughter how sin leads us to reject God. We will pray with them to understand the ways they reject God's rule in their lives and we will lead them to practice discussing what sin is and how it leads us to reject God with their friends.



Read and meditate on Romans 1:18-25 this week.

- As you meditate on these verses consider how you can discuss sin with your son or daughter. How can you lead your son or daughter in a conversation about how sin is a rejection of God? How can you model for your child repenting of thinking God is not enough? How can you help your son or daughter consider how to share the gospel with their friends?
- Ponder how you can help your son or daughter come up with a specific plan for sharing the gospel with one of their friends this week. How can you help them come up with conversation starters that lead to the gospel? What tools or resources can you equip them with to help them share the gospel with their friends?



Spend time in prayer this week.

- As you pray for your son or daughter, ask the Holy Spirit to give them boldness to share the gospel. Ask the Holy Spirit to help your son or daughter have a repentant heart and a heart that believes and knows God is enough.
- Spend time praying with your student. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you all to share the gospel with lost people in your lives. Pray for many opportunities and boldness to take those opportunities.



Help your son or daughter come up with at least two conversation starters that center around the lies we believe about God, such as God is not enough.

- Talk through and brainstorm ways your son or daughter can use these conversation starters to share the gospel with one of their lost friends this week.
- Discuss with your student ways that you have shared the gospel with lost people. Share some of the ways you've been able to use your own struggles to share the gospel with others. Encourage your student to share the gospel with one friend this week.
