

**BIG TRUTH: GOD IS MAKING ALL THINGS NEW**

Isaiah 66:22, Isaiah 65:17, 2 Corinthians 5:17, Romans 8:29, 2 Peter 3:13, Romans 8:23, Revelation 3:12

**BIBLE VERSE: REVELATION 21:5**

“And He who was seated on the throne said, ‘Behold, I am making all things new.’ Also He said, ‘Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.’”

**BIG IDEAS**

- A new heaven and earth are coming.
- A people made new from every tribe, tongue, and nation is coming.
- New worship that is holy and undivided is coming.

**BIBLE PASSAGE: REVELATION 21**

John, while exiled to the Island of Patmos, has a vision of the new heaven and earth. In his vision, he sees that God will make all things new by ushering in a new earth that no longer has sorrow, pain, and sin in them. Those who have believed in Christ will live forever with God in this new earth.

**THE STORY**

The Story is the good news of the gospel. All of Scripture tells the Story of God the Father’s work to redeem a people from the power of sin through God the Son so that they might live for His glory through the power of the Holy Spirit. During this series we will explore the four main movements of the Story of God, and our response to the life-altering Gospel Story!

**BIG AIMS****Every student should know that:**

- God is the author, subject, and hero of the gospel story
- Salvation comes by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone

**Every student should feel:**

- Brokenness over the depth of our sin against God
- Joy in Jesus, our Savior and King

**Every student should strive to:**

- Describe the gospel message through Creation, Fall, Redemption, and New Creation
- Memorize the Bible verse each week

**Every student should want:**

- To study the Bible so that they can better understand God’s story of redemption
- To share the gospel story with those who are separated from God in their sin

**STUDENT WORKOUT:**

One day, God will make all things new. This week we will ponder what the new earth will be like. We will pray for understanding of how to live for God now looking forward to His return. We will practice worship that is holy and undivided and seek to share the gospel with our friends.

THINGS NEW**Ponder what the new earth will be like by considering a world without sin.**

- Consider how a sinless world changes life. In what ways does sin affect our life now? How does sin distract our worship? How will our worship be different in the new earth? How can we live now looking toward the new earth?

**Read Revelation 21.**

- Consider Christ's return and how it will usher in a new life for His redeemed. How will our lives be different on the new earth? How will the body of Christ look different on the new earth? How can we partner with believers of different ethnicities and cultures now as we look toward life on the new earth?

**Spend time praying each day this week.**

- As you pray, ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to recognize the ways that your worship now is divided and hindered by your sin or the struggles of this world. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you practice worshiping in a holy and undivided way.
- Spend time praying with your parent or small group leader this week. Pray for opportunities to share the gospel with your friends. Pray for a greater understanding of what the new earth will be like.

**Make a list of friends who do not profess to know Christ.**

- Choose one or two of the people on your list to share the gospel with this week. Think of ways you can talk with your friends about the gospel and what life will be like when Christ returns.
- Consider the ways that your worship now is tainted by sin. Make a list of some of the things you worship instead of God. Talk with your parent or small group leader about these things and ways to focus your worship on Christ alone.
