

BIG TRUTH: GOD IS KNOWN

Psalm 76:1; John 1:14, 1:18; Romans 1:19; 1 Corinthians 8:3

BIBLE VERSE: JOHN 1:14

“And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.”

BIG IDEAS

- God makes Himself known through His creation.
- God makes Himself known through His Word.
- God makes Himself known through His Son.

BIBLE PASSAGE: EXODUS 3

FOUNDATION: GOD IS

“God is” means that there is only one god in the universe. He alone is Lord over everything that exists, and He alone is worthy of our worship. This also means that every good thing that exists comes from God. All good things come from Him because goodness is a part of who He is as the one true God. It is a part of His nature and character to be good, and everything that comes from God is good. Thankfully God has not chosen to withhold His goodness from His creation, but instead gives it freely to us.

SERIES AIMS



Every student should know that...

- There is only one true God, and He is good.
- We can know God because He has made Himself known through creation and Word.
- God alone is our source of life and joy.



Every student should feel...

- Loved by God, and thankful for His love for us.
- Broken over the depth of our sin against God.
- Joy in Jesus, the only Son of God who came to save us.



Every student should strive to...

- Memorize the Bible verse each week about who God is.
- Pray that God would open their hearts and minds to know Him more.
- Tell someone else about the God who is.



Every student should ask God to...

- Learn more about the God who has made Himself known.
- Repent of their sin and of the lies they believe about God.
- Cling to God as the source of truth.

FAMILY WORKOUT:

This week we will ponder how to help our son or daughter understand how to know God. We will pray for their hearts to grow in their desire and understanding of how to know God and we will lead them to practice seeing God in His Word and creation.



Read and meditate on Exodus 3 this week. As you consider this chapter, ask yourself some of these questions:

- How does God reveal Himself in creation? How can I help my son or daughter see God's revelation of Himself in creation?
- How can I lead my son or daughter to seek God in His Word?

Consider how you can model seeking God in His Word this week. How can you discuss with your son or daughter that it is God's Word that helps us know Him?



Spend time in prayer this week for your son or daughter to know God more personally.

Pray for them to grow in their understanding of Him through a study of His Word.

Pray with your son or daughter this week. As you pray, model asking God to help you know Him through His Word and your relationship with Jesus.



Help your son or daughter make a list of attributes of God they see in Creation and in His Word.

Discuss with your student ways that he or she can share the gospel with a friend this week.
