

BIG TRUTH: GOD IS SPIRIT

Genesis 1:2; Isaiah 61:1; Ezekiel 26:27; 1 Corinthians 2:11, 3:16; Ephesians 1:13-14, 2:18; Romans 8:9-11; Galatians 5:17

BIBLE VERSE: JOHN 4:24

“God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.”

BIG IDEAS

- The Holy Spirit makes God’s people alive.
- The Holy Spirit lives within God’s people.
- The Holy Spirit helps God’s people live faithfully.

BIBLE PASSAGE: EZEKIEL 37:1-14**FOUNDATION: GOD IS**

“God is” means that there is only one god in the universe. He alone is Lord over everything that exists, and He alone is worthy of our worship. This also means that every good thing that exists comes from God. All good things come from Him because goodness is a part of who He is as the one true God. It is a part of His nature and character to be good, and everything that comes from God is good. Thankfully God has not chosen to withhold His goodness from His creation, but instead gives it freely to us.

SERIES AIMS**Every student should know that...**

- There is only one true God, and He is good.
- We can know God because He has made Himself known through creation and Word.
- God alone is our source of life and joy.

**Every student should feel...**

- Loved by God, and thankful for His love for us.
- Broken over the depth of our sin against God.
- Joy in Jesus, the only Son of God who came to save us.

**Every student should strive to...**

- Memorize the Bible verse each week about who God is.
- Pray that God would open their hearts and minds to know Him more.
- Tell someone else about the God who is.

**Every student should ask God to...**

- Learn more about the God who has made Himself known.
- Repent of their sin and of the lies they believe about God.
- Cling to God as the source of truth.

STUDENT WORKOUT:

This week we will ponder the Holy Spirit and the ways that He helps us. We will pray for a greater understanding of who the Holy Spirit is and we will practice being guided by the Holy Spirit in our daily lives.



Read and meditate on Ezekiel 37:1-14 this week. As you read and think on these verses, consider these questions:

- Who is the Holy Spirit and what is significant about Him?
- How has the Holy Spirit given you new life?
- How have you seen the Holy Spirit breathe new life into someone else?

Consider the truth that the Holy Spirit is your helper. How has the Spirit helped you? Do you rely upon the Spirit's help to overcome sin and temptation? How can you better rely upon the Holy Spirit in your daily life?



Spend time praying for a greater understanding of who the Holy Spirit is this week.

Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to a deeper understanding of who He is and how He works in your life.

Set aside time to pray with your parents this week. As you pray with them, ask the Holy Spirit to help you use His power to live faithfully for Him.



Memorize John 4:24 this week by writing the verse on an index card or by putting it in your phone.

Look it over every day this week until you have it memorized.

Create a chart that shows who the Holy Spirit is and the many functions He performs in a believer's life. Next, write out specific ways you can submit to the Holy Spirit's work in your life in one or two of these areas.

Discuss your chart with your small group leader. Discuss ways you can successfully use the power of the Holy Spirit to live faithfully for God this week.
