

BIG TRUTH: GOD IS REDEEMER

Exodus 6:6; 2 Samuel 7:23; Psalm 130:7; Romans 3:24; Colossians 1:13-14; 1 Corinthians 1:30; Ephesians 1:7; Titus 2:13-14; Hebrews 9:12; Revelation 5:9

BIBLE VERSE: ISAIAH 49:26B

“Then all flesh shall know that I am the Lord your Savior, and your Redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob.”

BIG IDEAS

- Sin separates us from God.
- Separation from God leaves us hopeless and in need of a redeemer.
- God paid redemption’s price to save us.

BIBLE PASSAGE: RUTH 1-4

FOUNDATION: GOD IS

“God is” means that there is only one god in the universe. He alone is Lord over everything that exists, and He alone is worthy of our worship. This also means that every good thing that exists comes from God. All good things come from Him because goodness is a part of who He is as the one true God. It is a part of His nature and character to be good, and everything that comes from God is good. Thankfully God has not chosen to withhold His goodness from His creation, but instead gives it freely to us.

SERIES AIMS



Every student should know that...

- There is only one true God, and He is good.
- We can know God because He has made Himself known through creation and Word.
- God alone is our source of life and joy.



Every student should feel...

- Loved by God, and thankful for His love for us.
- Broken over the depth of our sin against God.
- Joy in Jesus, the only Son of God who came to save us.



Every student should strive to...

- Memorize the Bible verse each week about who God is.
- Pray that God would open their hearts and minds to know Him more.
- Tell someone else about the God who is.



Every student should ask God to...

- Learn more about the God who has made Himself known.
- Repent of their sin and of the lies they believe about God.
- Cling to God as the source of truth.

FAMILY WORKOUT:

This week we will ponder how to discuss with our son or daughter the truth that God paid our redemption price. We will pray with them to grow in their trust of God as the Redeemer and we will lead them to practice telling others about the Redeemer.



Read and meditate on Ruth 1-4 this week. As you consider this story, ask yourself some of these questions:

- How can you lead your son or daughter to a greater understanding of what a Redeemer is? How can you discuss the story of Ruth and Naomi with your son and daughter this week in a way that helps them see that God is our Redeemer?
- How can you model telling others that God is the Redeemer? How can you lead your son or daughter to tell others that God paid our redemption price?



Set aside time to pray for your son or daughter this week.

As you pray for them, ask the Holy Spirit to guide them to a greater understanding of Jesus as the Redeemer. Ask the Holy Spirit to produce in them a joy and praise to Him as their Redeemer.

Pray with your student this week. As you pray together, model praising God for sending the Redeemer to save us from our sin.



Help your son or daughter create a list of verses that teach us Jesus is the Redeemer.

Help them find the verses and talk through what a few of them mean and the hope they give.

Discuss with your son or daughter some of the ways you've found hope in having Jesus as your Redeemer. Discuss some ways your son or daughter can find hope in Jesus as his or her Redeemer.

Discuss with your student some ways that he or she can share the truth that God paid our redemption price with someone else this week.
