BIG TRUTH: SERVANTS OF JESUS HAVE ONE MASTER

Joshua 24:16; 1 Samuel 7:3; 1 Kings 18:21; Romans 6:16; James 4:4; 1 John 2:15-17

BIBLE VERSE: MATTHEW 6:24

“No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one or love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.”

BIG IDEAS

- Jesus is our treasure, so we live for His kingdom instead of our kingdoms.
- Jesus is our Savior, so we shift our devotion from false saviors to the true Savior.
- Jesus is our provision, so we walk by faith instead of living in anxiety and worry.

BIBLE PASSAGE: MATTHEW 6:19-34

UNITE - I AM CALLED

The Unite Year is an exploration of what it means to be united in Christ as the family of God (Romans 12:5). When we are saved, we are given a spirit of adoption as sons (Romans 8:15-16), are made a child of God, and we are also saved into a family- the Church. The Unite Year explores how we are to live as a part of a family, and to live in light of our calling as servants and disciples of Christ. We use our gifts to build up the church as we pursue unity, humility, and gentleness with our brothers and sisters in Christ (Ephesians 4:1-2).

SERIES AIMS



Every student should know that...

- They are a servant of Jesus.
- They have been forgiven an unimaginable debt.
- To be a servant means to lay down their lives



Every student should feel...

- Awe at the forgiveness they have experienced in Christ.
- Thankful for the grace that brought them from death to life and into God's family.
- Unworthy of the mercy and grace they have received



Every student should strive to...

- Forgive anyone who has wronged them as Jesus has forgiven them.
- Walk by faith instead of giving into anxiety.
- Be known by their allegiance to Christ and the gospel.



Every student should want...

- To be faithful and pursue obedience to God.
- To sacrifice their comfort and control for the sake of the gospel.
- To be committed to Christ above all else.

STUDENT WORKOUT:

This week we will ponder what our treasure is and who our master is. We will pray for hearts that treasure Jesus above all. We will practice living for His kingdom and not our own.

Read and meditate on Matthew 6:19-34 this week.

As you ponder these verses ask yourself some of these questions:

- What do you treasure? Who is your master? For whose kingdom are you living?
- What are some earthly things you are tempted to pursue and trust in? How can you remove these things from your heart?

Ponder what it means to live for God's kingdom.

- How can you live for His kingdom in your daily life?
- What are some ways you have been living for His kingdom?



Pray for a heart that treasures Jesus above all other things.

- Ask the Holy Spirit to show you the things you treasure above Jesus and repent of them.
- Pray with your small group leader this week. As you pray, ask the Holy Spirit to help you live more fully for God's kingdom.



Make a T-Chart that compares earthly kingdoms with God's kingdom.

- In this chart, list some of the things you do each day or week that are for your kingdom and list the things you do that are for God's kingdom. Evaluate your chart and commit to live more fully for God's kingdom over your kingdom.
- Discuss with your small group leader ways you can live by faith and trust God for provision.
